

Plan to re-open Weekday Christian Preschool (WCP)

Presumed opening date for school to begin is Oct. 5, 2020. Subject to change in accordance with any State or local mandates and guidelines.

Office Hours

The Preschool office is currently not open to the public during school hours. Appointments and tours may be scheduled after 1:30. Masks are required. Hand sanitizer is readily available. Equipment in the office will be sanitized and disinfected.

Preparing for opening

Teachers and staff are required to wear masks and have been trained in proper covid sanitation procedures.

Teachers have removed some toys from classrooms in order to make it possible to sanitize and disinfect toys at the end of each day with Basic G, which is a quantitative ammonia product. It is safe to spray on toys and let air dry.

The carpets in the classrooms have been professionally cleaned before opening.

All furniture and toys will be cleaned with a hospital grade sanitizer/disinfectant before school begins.

Dress up clothes will be put away temporarily. As restrictions are lifted, we will reintroduce our dress up center.

Each classroom will have a "to be cleaned" bucket to immediately put away any toy that has been in a mouth, sneezed or coughed on. Bucket and toys will be washed, sanitized and disinfected at the end of each day.

Water Fountain will be blocked off and not available for use.

School Day Procedures

Staff members are required to stay home if they are not feeling well. All staff will conduct temperature check and review a health questionnaire before coming to school. Anything over 100.4 is considered a temperature and will not be permitted on the premises.

Upon entering the building, staff and students must immediately wash hands.

Parents will not enter the building. They will check their child in and out with their cell phone through the Brightwheel App. There will be a Scan code posted outside the preschool doors. We will mark off a safe distance to stand, or parents can wait in their car and come up one at a time. They scan the code with their phone to check in, review a health questionnaire, and a staff member will scan student's temperature. If above 100.4 they will be sent home with their parent. If below 100.4 staff will bring them in, wash hands, and then take them to their classroom.

Pick up procedure requires parents to scan code and staff will bring student to them, one at a time.

Students will be in a "pod" classroom environment. Pod 1 will consist of Toddlers and Twos (room 7 and 8). Pod 2 will be the Threes (room 5 and 6). Pod 3 will be the Fours (room 3 and 4). Pods will stay to themselves not changing classrooms or co-mingling with other pods during school time. Each pod will have their specified outdoor time and the Music Teacher will travel to each pod and students will be distanced as much as each classroom allows.

We will increase scheduled handwashing.

Teachers will be required to wear a mask and are being provided a face shield(optional). Students over 3 will be encouraged to wear a face mask.

Depending upon class size, we will distance students at lunch time accordingly.

WCP will not be offering early or late care at this time; in order to stick with the pod theory. We are expanding our class day until 1:30pm as an option for parents.

Parents will be given a copy of this plan and asked to acknowledge separately that they understand even with these precautions in place we cannot guarantee that students are not exposed to Covid 19.

Parents will also be asked to keep any sick child home and to err on the side of caution. We also ask that parents notify WCP of any known exposure to Covid and self-quarantine accordingly.

Any sign of sickness during class, the student will be moved to the glass classroom with a staff member supervising, until an authorized person is here to pick them up. Student may not return without a note from a doctor.

If a student or staff member tests positive for Covid 19 we will immediately notify all students and staff. The Pod that is affected will be notified and parents will be asked to pick up their child as soon as possible. All affected rooms will be deep cleaned, sanitized and disinfected. We will monitor to see if we need to close the school.

We will follow CDC and local health official's guidance on when we can safely re-open the affected class rooms. We will also monitor local school districts plans for reopening after a confirmed case.

As these procedures are fluid and constantly changing, we will change in accordance with any guidelines that come out moving forward.
